The dark ages saw a significant pull back or reversal of the march of coin production progress seen before that. German tribes, the Byzantine Empire, Central Asian, the Chinese, and other smaller societies had limited coin production and used what was already out there for their money. The earlier beautiful artwork was lost. These coins are not terribly expensive. Condition is where it is of course. Check them out.
